Professional Accomplishments:

- At Rutgers University, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, restructured and led the research support infrastructure, allowing the University to become a national leader in COVID-19 research, including the development of the rapid saliva test (for SARS-CoV-2 coronavirus), and the inauguration of *The Rutgers University Center for COVID-19 Response and Pandemic Preparedness (CCRP2)*. Transformed the Institutional Review Board and Human Subjects Protection Program, leading to accreditation by the *Association for the Accreditation of Human Research Protection Programs (AAHRPP)* and measurable improvements in operational effectiveness. Lead a university-wide effort to transform the research support infrastructure, ensuring greater integration, effectiveness, and efficiency. As part of the leadership of the Academic Affairs division, I led an effort to incorporate diversity, inclusion, and equity principles in the curriculum, research agenda, and administration of the University. Helped to inaugurate the Research Development function, increasing private and public support for the University's sponsored research.
- At New York University, developed a global support model to serve over seven hundred principal investigators (research faculty), working in nearly 30 countries, managing 2000 projects totaling over \$300 million in annual expenditures. Codified all policies and procedures governing sponsored research financed through grants and contracts; developed an on-line compliance training program for faculty and their staff. Developed a comprehensive compliance audit function, ensuring clean audits for all nine years of my tenure. Fully automated the research data and reporting function. Developed a host of dashboards ensuring greater financial/programmatic transparency Developed the first

university-based robotic accounting system. Increased faculty satisfaction with research administration, moving from 46 out of 48 departments to the top five for the last six years of my tenure.
